Call to Order: 11:35 a.m.

With prior notice given in accordance with the Alabama Open Meetings Act, and with a quorum of fourteen members present, Board Vice-Chairman Michael T. Flanagan, M.D., convened the public portion of the meeting of the Alabama State Board of Medical Examiners.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director Sarah Moore reported on the following items: 1) The distribution to and set-up of Surface Pro devices for Board members for secure access to monthly agenda items and other Board communication; 2) The ongoing research being conducted into the use of ShareFile; and 3) A Board member training session is planned for June 19, 2019.

MINUTES

Public Minutes of April 11, 2019 The Credentials Committee recommended that the Public Minutes of April 11, 2019, be approved. The motion was adopted without objection.

Special Called Meeting Minutes of April 13, 2019 The Credentials Committee recommended that the Minutes of the Special Called Meeting of April 13, 2019, be approved. The motion was adopted without objection.

CURRENT BUSINESS

Administrative Rules for Final Adoption

Administrative Rule 540-X-2-.01, Definitions The Credentials Committee recommended that Administrative Rule 540-X-2-.01 be approved for final adoption. The motion was adopted without objection.

Other

Physician / Pharmacist Collaboration After consideration of an oral report by Executive Director Sarah Moore, a motion and a second was made to propose a substitution to HB 35 and oppose as engrossed by the House. The motion was adopted without objection.

Resolution: Request for Attorney General's Opinion Re: Ala. Code § 34-24-337(d)-(j) and Ala. Code § 34-24-524 The Credentials Committee recommended that the resolution seeking an opinion from Attorney General Steve Marshall be adopted. The motion was adopted without objection.

Tianeptine – ADPH Correspondence The Credentials Committee recommended that the correspondence from Scott Harris, M.D., State Health Officer, be received as information. The motion was adopted without objection.

Requests for Board Opinion

Autopsy Licensing Requirement After consideration of correspondence from Autopsy, PC, which asks, *Is a medical license required to eviscerate a body for pathologic examination?*, the Credentials Committee recommended that the Board issue the following opinion: A medical license is required in Alabama to eviscerate a body for pathological examination; however, a properly trained diener, operating under the supervision of a physician licensed in this state, may perform the evisceration of the decedent in order to retrieve the organs and tissues and transport them to the physician for examination and diagnosis. The motion was adopted without objection.

CoolSculpting and Exilis After consideration of an inquiry concerning the use of CoolSculpting and Exilis devices which asks, *When does the physician have to be on premise or on site?*, the Credentials Committee recommended that the Board issue the following opinion: CoolSculpting and Exilis are non-ablative medical devices which affect living tissue. If the use of the device to perform the procedure is delegated to a properly trained Level 2 Delegate, then the

physician should be onsite and immediately available. For Level 1 Delegates, i.e. PAs/CRNPs/CNMs, in an approved collaborative or supervisory practice, for which the specific skill is approved, remote site practice is allowed and the physician is not required to be on-site. The motion was adopted without objection.

The Credentials Committee recommended that an educational article be included in the Board's newsletter concerning the appropriate delegation of the use of lasers and other modalities affecting living tissue, and further recommended that the Board's concern regarding the unsupervised use of these and similar devices in "spa" settings be conveyed to the Attorney General's office. The motion was adopted without objection.

Examination via Telemedicine Prior to Non-Ablative Treatment After consideration of correspondence from The Paperwork Doctor, LLC, inquiring as to whether the examination required pursuant to Administrative Rule 540-X-11-.04 prior to an initial, non-ablative laser treatment may be accomplished via telemedicine, the Credentials Committee recommended that the Board issue the following opinion: If a physician is capable of conducting a proper and sufficient examination via telemedicine, while adhering to the same standard of care as an in-person examination, and a proper collaborative or supervisory practice agreement, pursuant to Board rules, is in place with the mid-level provider who will be with the client/patient at the time of the examination, then such examination via telemedicine would be permissible for the purpose of satisfying Rule 540-X-11-.04(2). The motion was adopted without objection.
