

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is required prior to making application for the QACSC, and shall be required to obtain the remaining 4 hours through a Board approved course in advanced pharmacology and prescribing trends related to controlled substances. The Committee recommended that P.A.s be required to obtain 4 hours of Category 1 continuing medical education regarding the prescribing of controlled substances every two years as a requirement to renew and maintain the QACSC. The motion was adopted.

Administrative Rule 540-X-14-.12, Grace Period and Notice The Credentials Committee recommended that the amendment to Administrative Rule 540-X-14-12 be approved for publication for public comment in the *Alabama Administrative Monthly*. The motion was adopted.

Administrative Rule 540-X-14-.13, Reinstatement After Revocation of License The Credentials Committee recommended that the amendment to Administrative Rule 540-X-14-.13 be approved for publication for public comment in the *Alabama Administrative Monthly*. The motion was adopted.

<u>Delegation of Certain Physician Duties to Non-Physicians</u> The Credentials Committee recommended that the Board rescind its previous opinion that a physician should not

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delegate to a Registered Health Information Technician the physician's duty of dictating a discharge summary. The motion was adopted.

Board Opinion Re: Responsibility of Physician for Discharge Summary, Delegation of Dictation Duty to Registered Health Information Technician - The Credentials Committee recommended that the Board adopt the opinion that a physician may delegate to a Registered Health Information Technician the duty of dictating a discharge summary from information already documented in the record. The expectation of the Board is that the discharge summary will include all pertinent information which would be required by physicians providing subsequent care, including: admitting diagnosis, discharge diagnosis, discharge medications, follow-up plans and an appropriately detailed narrative of the patient's hospital course. The dictated discharge summary shall be reviewed and signed by the physician who shall accept full responsibility for the summary. The motion was adopted.

<u>Employment Policies - Health and Hospitalization Insurance</u> The Credentials Committee recommended that the policy regarding employee health and hospitalization insurance be approved. The motion was adopted.

<u>FSMB - Liaison Program</u> The Credentials Committee recommended that the information regarding the FSMB's Liaison Program be received as information. The motion was adopted.

<u>International Medical Graduate - Post Graduate Education Certification</u> The Credentials Committee recommended that the Board affirm the current statute, <u>Code of Alabama</u> § 34-

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24-70(2)2, which states, All other applicants for a certificate of qualification who graduated from a college of medicine not accredited by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education of the American Medical Association or a college of osteopathy not accredited by the American Osteopathic Association shall present evidence satisfactory to the board that the applicant has completed three years of postgraduate or residency training in any of the following programs: a) A program listed in the directory of approved residency training programs published by the American Medical Association. b) A program accredited by the American Osteopathic Association. c) A program accredited by the Accreditation Committee of Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. d) A program accredited by the College of Family Physicians of Canada. The motion was adopted.

<u>Prescribing Controlled Drugs - Presentation Evaluation</u> The Credentials Committee recommended that the Presentation Evaluation be received as information. The motion was adopted.

Synagis® After consideration of correspondence from Health Information Designs, the Credentials Committee recommended notifying Mr. DiBennedetto that the Board would not consider it to be unprofessional conduct by a physician should the physician allow Synagis®, unused by another patient, to be used for other qualified patients within the same physician's practice under the conditions described in the correspondence of August 19, 2009; however, the Board recommends to Mr. DiBennedetto that he direct his question to the Alabama Board of Pharmacy under whose jurisdiction the question should be considered. The motion was adopted.

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<u>Article, Collaborative Practice: CMS Implements New Rules</u> The Credentials Committee recommended that the article be received as information. The motion was adopted.

Article, <u>Doctor of Nursing Practice Candidates Meet in Montgomery</u> The Credentials Committee recommended that the article be received as information. The motion was adopted.

2009-2010 Lease Contract The Credentials Committee recommended that the 2009 - 2010 Contract for the Provision of Office Space be approved. The motion was adopted.

Statement of Economic Interests Reporting Requirements After consideration of correspondence from Hugh R. Evans, III, Esq., General Counsel for the State of Alabama Ethics Commission, a motion was made to receive as information the notification from Mr. Evans that members of the Alabama Board of Medical Examiners are not required to file Statements of Economic Interest forms; however, the Board was advised that they are subject to all other regulations contained in the Ethics Law. The motion was adopted.

ABME Hearing Schedule The Credentials Committee recommended that the ABME Hearing Schedule be received as information. The motion was adopted.

Brian E. Cressman., M.D., Jasper After consideration of testimony presented during a hearing before the Board, a motion was made to continue the hearing and defer disposition pending receipt of additional expert evidence from an endocrinologist to be selected by the Board and to further receive articles of prospective, randomized, double-blinded studies showing that raising testosterone levels from low normal to high normal resulted in

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objective, measurable improvements in patient health. The motion was adopted.

John P. Hagler, Jr., M.D., Montgomery After consideration of a Request for Reconsideration filed on behalf of Dr. Hagler, a motion was made and adopted to withdraw the Board's prior Order of August 28, 2009, and to enter an Order restricting Dr. Hagler's prescribing of Schedule II controlled substances to nursing homes, hospitals and hospice settings only and to conduct random patient chart reviews every six months.
