JOINT SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT
COME NOW, the Alabama State Board of Medical Examiners, Complainant, and SHARON G. GRIFFITTS, M.D., Respondent, and respectfully submit this Joint Settlement Agreement to the Medical Licensure Commission, seeking the entry of the attached Consent Order to resolve the disciplinary charges filed against the Respondent's medical license. In support thereof, the Parties state as follows:

## STIPULATION

1. The Respondent, SHARON G. GRIFFITTS, M.D., was duly licensed to practice medicine or osteopathy in the state of Alabama on January 1, 1998, having been issued license number MD.21438, and the Respondent was so licensed at all times relevant to the matters asserted herein.
2. It is admitted by Dr. Griffitts that on or about December 22, 2019, Dr. Griffitts submitted or caused to be submitted an Alabama medical license renewal application for the year 2020 on which the certification was made that the annual minimum continuing medical education requirement of 25 credits had been met or would be met by December 31, 2019, and the licensee had supporting documents if audited.
3. Dr. Griffitts admits that, in fact, the required number of continuing medical education credits necessary for renewal of the 2019 license had not been obtained and/or that
supporting documentation was not produced; specifically, Dr. Griffitts obtained no valid credits.
4. Dr. Griffitts aclnowledges and admits that the foregoing facts constitute grounds for the imposition of disciplinary sanctions against the licensee's license to practice medicine or osteopathy in Alabama, specifically, a violation of Ala. Code § 34-24-360(23) and Medical Licensure Commission Rule 545-X-5-.02. Dr. Griffitts consents and agrees to the entry by the Medical Licensure Commission of Alabama of the consent order stated herein, and agrees to be bound by the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and terms and conditions stated therein. Dr. Sharon G. Griffitts, M.D. waives any further findings of fact and conclusions of law with respect to the above-styled matter and waives any right to appeal of the joint settlement agreement and consent order.
5. It is stipulated and agreed between the parties that this joint settlement agreement and consent order be submitted to the Medical Licensure Commission of Alabama, and that they are subject to the Commission's approval. It is further agreed by the parties that the Medical Licensure Commission shall be permitted to examine and review, prior to approval of this settlement, the records and documents now in the possession of the Board of Medical Examiners conceming the stipulation of facts set forth herein. ## JOINT SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

COME NOW, the Alabama State Board of Medical Examiners, Complainant, and THOMAS J. It is admitted by Dr. Leytham that on or about December 16, 2019, Dr. Leytham submitted or caused to be submitted an Alabama medical license renewal application for the year 2020 on which the certification was made that the annual minimum continuing medical education requirement of 25 credits had been met or would be met by December 31, 2019, and the licensee had supporting documents if audited.
3. Dr. Leytham admits that, in fact, the required number of continuing medical education credits necessary for renewal of the 2019 license had not been obtained and/or that
supporting documentation was not produced; specifically, Dr. Leytham obtained sixteen valid credits.
4. Dr. Leytham acknowledges and admits that the foregoing facts constitute grounds for the imposition of disciplinary sanctions against the licensee's license to practice medicine or osteopathy in Alabama, specifically, a violation of Ala. Code § 34-24-360(23) and Medical Licensure Commission Rule 545-X-5-.02. Dr. Leytham consents and agrees to the entry by the Medical Licensure Commission of Alabama of the consent order stated herein, and agrees to be bound by the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and terms and conditions stated therein. Dr. Thomas J. Leytham, M.D. waives any further findings of fact and conclusions of law with respect to the above-styled matter and waives any right to appeal of the joint settlement agreement and consent order.

## ORDER

This matter comes before the Medical Licensure Commission of Alabama for a probation compliance hearing on October 27, 2021, by Order of September 29, 2021, in the above-styled cause. Dr. Kathleen A. Cullen having been duly notified in accordance with the Alabama Administrative Procedures Act, was not present and was not represented by counsel. The Alabama Board of Medical Examiners appeared through counsel and presented evidence.

## Finding

From the evidence submitted at said October 27, 2021 hearing, the Medical Licensure Commission of Alabama finds as follows:

1. By Order of the Medical Licensure Commission of Alabama, dated February 24, 2021, Dr. Cullen was fined Ten Thousand Dollars $(\$ 10,000)$ and her license to practice medicine in the State of Alabama was revoked. The revocation was stayed, and her license was placed on probation subjected to the following:
a. Successful completion of a medical education course on medical ethics, approved by the Alabama Board of Medical Examiners, within six months of February 24, 2021 (i.e., August 24, 2021); and
b. Payment of the $\$ 10,000$ fine accessed within said six-month period.
2. Roland K. Johnson, Director of Physicians Monitoring Program testified that Dr. Cullen has neither paid the $\$ 10,000$ fine nor completed a medical education course on medical ethics.
3. Mr. Johnson further testified that Dr. Cullen was aware of the hearing and the requirement she attend the hearing in person.

## CONCLUSIONS

Based on these findings, the Commission concludes as follows:
Dr. Kathleen A. Cullen is not compliant with the terms of probation set forth
in the February 24, 2021 Order of the Commission.

## DETERMINATION

It is therefore ORDERED that the February 24, 2021 Stay of Revocation is hereby LIFTED and Dr . Kathleen A. Cullen's license to practice medicine in the State of Alabama is REVOKED.

## ORDER

The Commission's Order of November 10, 2020, shall be and is hereby amended and replaced in its entirety as set out below:

This matter came before the Medical Licensure Commission of Alabama at its meeting on October 29, 2020 on the request by Dr. Travis to lift the probation of and/or restrictions on her license in the above case. Dr. Travis appeared and testified. The Board of Medical Examiners was represented by Mr. Wilson Hunter.

Based upon the testimony at the hearing, the Commission has determined that it will lift the probation and/or restrictions on Dr. Travis's medical license upon completion of the following:

1. Dr. Travis shall attend and complete the continuing medical education course entitled Prescribing Controlled Drugs offered by Vanderbilt University, or a comparable course which has been pre-approved by the Commission, and shall submit to the Commission certification of said completion; Dr. Travis shall successfully complete the entire course and shall, in addition to the submission of the certificate of completion, execute an affidavit in which Dr. Travis shall state under oath the name of the course taken, and that she "successfully completed the entire course";
2. Dr. Travis shall submit to the Commission verification of all continuing medical education classes/seminars she has completed in the last two years;
3. Dr. Travis shall enter into a contract with the Alabama Professionals Health Program (APHP), which contract shall require that Dr. Travis continue to see her psychiatrist or psychologist at least quarterly during the term of the contract, and that she see her regular physician at least annually during the term of the contract; Dr. Travis shall submit a copy of said contract to the Commission; and
4. Dr. Travis shall execute any and all releases with APHP necessary to allow APHP to release information to the Commission, and cause APHP to submit to the Commission quarterly reports from her psychiatrist or psychologist and annual reports from her regular physician.
