Dear Dr. Provenzano:

The Alabama State Board of Medical Examiners (“the Board”) met on April 10, 2025, and considered your renewed application for a certificate of qualification to practice medicine in Alabama. The Board voted to deny your application based on a probable cause finding that you “. . . submitted or caused to be submitted false, misleading, or untruthful information to the Board in connection with an application for a certificate of qualification” and “committed at least one of the acts or offenses constituting grounds to discipline a license to practice medicine in this state” pursuant to Section 34-24-360 of the Alabama Code. See Ala. Admin. Code r. 540-X-3-.19(3) and (5).

Pursuant to Ala. Admin. Code r. 540-X-3-.19.1, you are hereby provided notice that you have the right to request a hearing before the Board for the opportunity to demonstrate that you meet all requirements for licensure as a physician. If you wish to request a hearing, please do so in writing via email or U.S. Mail **no later than Tuesday, April 29, 2025**. If you do not request a hearing, the Board will take action to deny your certification of qualification. The denial will be reported to the National Practitioner Data Bank (“NPDB”).
